Study Abroad at Accademia Italiana Check-List

The School of Design and Human Environment is affiliated with Accademia Italiana (AI) in Florence and Rome Italy. AI offers classes related to all four of the SDHE majors at both campuses in Florence and Rome.

If you are interested in studying abroad at AI, follow this step by step process listed below. It is the responsibility of each student interested in pursuing a study abroad opportunity with AI to follow through with each step.

Meet with your Academic Advisor and discuss which term would be best for you to attend AI.
Complete an online application for study abroad http://studyabroad.oregonstate.edu/apply and a \$50 application fee will be charged within a term of application submission. Complete the Mandatory Application Checklist.
Contact AI at info@ai-usa.org or study@ai-it.it to obtain information about studying abroad in Florence and Rome.
Apply to AI at http://www.accademiaitaliana.com/study-abroad-in-italy/apply-now.html
Once you have been accepted by AI, you will need to meet with your Academic Advisor to complete the course equivalence form.
Once you have been accepted by both OSU Study abroad and AI, contact the OSU Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships for any questions or information (If you need a delayed payment for AI, contact Study Abroad office). To receive financial aid from OSU you must take 3 courses during the term and 2 courses during the summer.
Fill out and turn in mandatory Risk, Safety, Academic and Health form to the OSU Study Abroad office at http://oregonstate.edu/international/studyabroad/documents/health_disclosure
Meet with OSU Study Abroad a month before departure to enroll in mandatory International insurance which is charged directly to your student account.
Enroll in BA 348 and BA 349 either the fall or spring term before you go abroad.
