Doug is a graduate of Oregon State University ('69) with a B.S. degree in international business and the Pacific Coast Banking School.



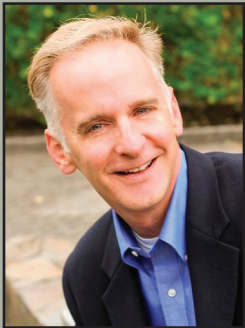
