All pre-professional students must meet the following requirements for admission to the program:

- The pre-professional program typically takes one year to complete. If accepted, the professional program will take 3 years to complete regardless of transfer credit standing.
- Maintain a 2.5 cumulative OSU GPA.
- Receive a C- or better in all courses within major.
- Complete: MTH 105, WR 121, and COMM 111/114/218.
- Satisfactory completion of pre-professional Art Foundation courses in major (listed below).
- Compete at least 40 credits of course work at OSU before the first term in the professional program. (Transfer credits: 15 OSU & 25 credits transfered from accredited institution).
- Register for GD 126 spring term of first year.
- Acceptance into the program is based on a committee decision pending completion of GD 126.
- Upon completion of GD 126 and review of students' portfolios, up to 25 students will be accepted to the Graphic Design Professional Program.
- This is a highly competitive and selective program.
- Students who do not gain acceptance may choose to apply the following year or transition into a different major.
