Note 3: Students may take MTH 251 to clear requirement, but must take MTH 112 prerequisite prior.

Note 4: Students admitted to OSU's College of Business with OSU catalog year 2020/21 or later will need to follow our business curriculum above. Some class requirements have changed from prior years. Talk with an advisor if you have questions.

Note 5: A professional development course(s), to help you transition to OSU and the College of Business will be required, but the specific course(s) will depend on your academic pathway.



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
