
Design Majors

Design majors complete common core requirements at the lower and upper division levels as well as courses specific to a major. Design majors include:

- Apparel Design*
- Interior Design*
- Design & Innovation Management
- Merchandising Management

NOTES: All majors listed above complete the same set of lower division courses. Business Majors: Refer to separate guide

Your Bachelor's Degree (BS) in the College of Business



- A minimum of 180 credits are required for graduation; 60 must be upper division (300 and 400-level courses).
- A maximum of 135 credits earned at a community college may be applied toward a bachelor's degree at OSU.
- Career, technical and pre-college courses numbered below 100 are not accepted by OSU.
- Some courses can count towards your major and the Baccalaureate Core.

^{*}An application is required for the Apparel & Interior Design programs. Students are admitted to the university as Pre-Apparel & Pre-Interior Design majors. Upon application and acceptance to the program, the major will change.

Important Notes & Resources

Important Notes for the College and Major:

- A grade of C- or higher is the minimum accepted grade in most design program courses. A grade of C or higher is required in some core courses associated with specific majors. Check with an OSU advisor.
- See a sample degree plan. Search by major (Apparel Design, Design & Innovation Management, etc.) at admissions.oregonstate.edu/find-your-major
- Other similar majors to explore: Management, Graphic Design, Art, Digital Communication Arts
- All majors have key OSU classes offered in the fall. Talk with an OSU advisor about your specific timeline.
- In addition to the classes listed above, design majors must complete 41 upper division common core
 credits as well as additional lower division requirements. Additional major-specific coursework (23-39
 credits) also required.
- Email cobtransfer@oregonstate.edu to be connected with a College of Business transfer advisor.
- Design majors automatically satisfy requirements for a B.S. degree. NOTE: B.A. degree not available for these majors.

Resources and OSU Information:

- Students do not have to complete a transfer degree in order to transfer to OSU.
 - o If you have earned an Oregon Transfer Degree, all lower division Baccalaureate Core requirements are complete.
